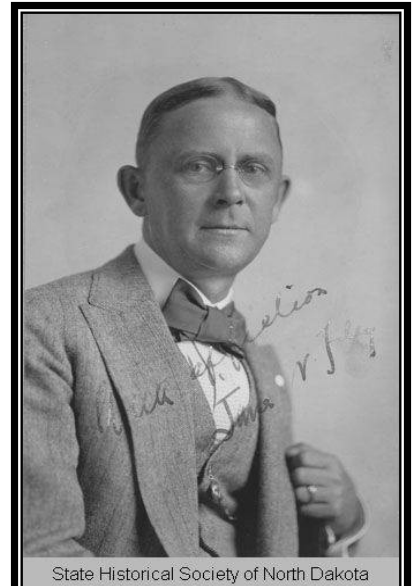

James Foley was inducted into the Bismarck High School Hall of Fame on October 8, 2010. Foley graduated from Bismarck High in 1888. Foley's first book, A Little Book of Prairie Breezes, was published in 1902. The Bismarck High School yearbook, Prairie Breezes, was named after Foley's book. Many books of poetry followed including the North Dakota Hymn.

We are proud to have the Foley home here at Buckstop Junction. In 1907 Foley built this American foursquare at 522 N. 6th Street in Bismarck. His family lived in the home until 1913. The home was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1977. The Bismarck Veterans Memorial Public Library donated the home to the Missouri Valley Historical Society and it was moved to Buckstop Junction in 1993.



The Rusk Auto House

After a 20 year wait John and Mike Beck have finally moved The Rusk Auto House to Buckstop Junction! This pre-fabricated metal garage was built in Fargo before World War 1, and is believed to be one of only two remaining in North Dakota; the second is at the ND Heritage Center.

This prefabricated galvanized iron garage: (18' X 12") was manufactured by The Fargo Cornice & Ornament Co.; it was discontinued in 1914 because iron was needed for World War 1.

Due to the popularity of motor cars the Rusk brothers began making this Auto house in 1912. An ad ran: "PORTABLE SAFE, DURABLE, ECONOMICAL, FIREPROOF, MANY/DESIGNS & ANY SIZE." A sincere thank you to Tom Weisbeck for donating the building to Buckstop Junction.

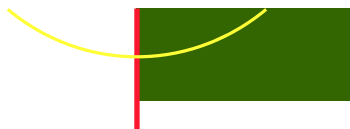
